## **Community Engagement Survey Comparative Results**

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Introduction



Between October 2019 and December 2019, Bayside City Council commenced the first phase of community engagement as part of the Bayside 2050 Community Vision project. This report contains the comparative data results from the survey component of the engagement program for Bayside's 2050 Community Vision.

The survey was delivered electronically via Bayside Have your Say website between 7 September 2019 and 15 December 2020<sup>1</sup>. 232 people participated in the 24-question survey, 193 of which were residents. The survey was designed to gather community aspirations, ideas, priorities for Bayside in 2050.

The data from the survey and face-to-face events has been combined and professionally analysed by Bartley Consulting. Bartley Consulting has grouped comments made in response to qualitative (or open-ended) questions by participants across both the survey and face-to-face sessions into broad categories or themes. These results can be found in the Bayside 2050 Community Vision – Wider Engagement Report.

Survey participants were asked several questions to determine information about them including their suburb or place residence, age, whether they were of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Island origin and whether they spoke a language other than English at home. This data was not collected in relation to other participants in other engagement activities.

This allowed their responses to be compared based on these variables. Full comparative wider engagement data tables based on these variables has been provided in this document and should serve as a companion document to the Wider Engagement Report.

## **Comparative data (survey only)**

Sample sizes for some cohorts, such as those aged 12 to 17, those who identified as ATSI, and residents from some Bayside suburbs were too small for a meaningful analysis of answers within these groups. Consequently, to provide a more meaningful analysis has been limited to the following groups

- Suburb
  - Beaumaris (n=27), Black Rock (n=18)) combined
  - Brighton (n=57) and Brighton East (n=15) combined
  - Hampton (n=19), Hampton East (n=4) and Sandringham (n=33) combined
  - Highett (n=10) and Cheltenham (n=7) combined
  - Ignore other locations (n=3)
- Age
  - Under 35 (n=14)
  - o 35-49 (n=61)
  - o 50 to 59 (n=47)
  - 60 to 69 (n=40)
  - o 70+ (n=24)
- LOTE
  - English only (n=158)
  - LOTE (n=33)

Additionally the data has been analysed according to household as follows:

- Single person (n=29)
- Couple (n=68)
- Parent(s) with children (n=89)

As only one person identified as an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander their results have not been separately analysed.

Most tables in this section should be read by column as follows:

- The column headings correspond to the group being analysed, for example Table A-1 shows the results for the total sample who were asked the question, subsequent columns show the results for groups of participants, such as Beaumaris and Black Rock residents, Brighton and Brighton East residents and so on through to Parent(s) with children at home; note that groups where the answer was not established are NOT shown in the table.
- The second row shows the number of participants in each group who answered the question (i.e. the sample size); in Table A-1 a total of 299 participants answered the question, 45 Beaumaris and Black Rock residents answered the question and so on
- The first column in the table lists the response options to the question.
- The percentages in subsequent columns indicate the proportion of survey participants in the group who gave the particular response (or thematically coded response); for example:
  - o 28% of the total sample of 299 participants who were asked question 1.1, provided answers that were thematically coded as "open spaces/parkland".
- The sum of the percentages in any given column only add to 100% if the question was single response, for example Question 4 in Table A-6;
- If the question was multiple response or open-ended (whereby a single response was coded under multiple themes) the sum of the responses in the column is likely to be greater than 100%, for example Question 1.1 in Table A-1.
